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From the Founders

We are proud to present the first Annual Report of Seniors in Seva (SIS), an organisation and a platform to facilitate pro-bono consulting by experienced professionals, connecting them with grassroots nonprofits, community-based organizations, social enterprises, and Farmer-Producer Organizations (FPOs).

While Seniors in Seva was formally registered as a charitable trust on 5th December 2022, it is an idea with which we had been working for almost two years prior. The first post that was published was via LinkedIn in December 2021, calling out to Seniors to enrol for this new initiative. During these early years, the support and guidance received from Dharmaraj, Megha, and Venkat of the India Welfare Trust were invaluable. As were the inputs that Ulhas Vairagkar provided.

However, the idea truly began to come alive when the five of us, all from the same batch of the Institute of Rural Management (IRMA), got together. The idea of Seniors in Seva resonated very strongly with our own life stages, and somehow the shared IRMA DNA made it easy to align on the purpose. This year, 2022-23, marks the formal beginning of that shared dream – to channel the expertise and passion of senior professionals towards purposeful engagements in India's social sector.

In this foundational year, we focused on building the vision, structure, and systems to bring the idea to life. We spent time consulting with ecosystem leaders, talking to potential volunteers and civil society actors, and understanding the real needs on both sides. We also focused on the backbone work – registering the Trust, defining our mission and operating principles, and initiating early outreach through conversations and connections.

Towards the end of the year, we began seeing the first signs of traction: senior professionals expressing interest in volunteering, and grassroots organizations beginning to articulate projects where such support could be valuable. This response affirmed our belief that there is a strong appetite for meaningful volunteering, especially post-retirement or in transitional career phases. We are grateful to our friends and families who provided the early support and contributions, enabling us to take the first few steps with courage and clarity. Their trust helped us set up essential systems and lay the groundwork for what SIS is becoming today.

Looking ahead, we recognize the immense potential of this idea — and the hard work needed to make it sustainable, scalable, and impactful. We remain committed to building a platform of integrity, empathy, and effectiveness, one that enables skilled senior professionals to serve, learn, and grow alongside India's vibrant community-based initiatives.

We thank every supporter, advisor, and well-wisher who stood by us in this first year. Together, we are building a bridge between wisdom and social change.

About Seniors in Seva

Seniors in Seva (SIS), is an initiative rooted in a shared desire to give back. The idea took shape when five long-time friends and batchmates from the Class of 1984, Institute of Rural Management Anand (IRMA) – Gayatri Kapoor, Gouri Krishna, Neelima Khetan, Probal Majumdar, and S. Devarajan – came together around the following question:

Could experienced professionals nearing or post-retirement be a resource for India's development sector?

Each of us had spent decades working across rural development, finance, marketing, IT, human resources, etc, in both corporate and nonprofit sectors. As we approached a new life stage, we saw an opportunity to channel our experience toward meaningful engagements with grassroots organizations. This vision gave rise to Seniors in Seva – a platform to connect skilled senior professionals with nonprofits and social enterprises in need of strategic, technical, and/or managerial support.

With encouragement and guidance from the India Welfare Trust's #EveryIndianVolunteering initiative, the concept was refined and formalized. Their support played a catalytic role – from helping design SIS's first volunteer survey to suggesting its name and connecting the team to the larger volunteering ecosystem.

On December 5, 2022, Seniors in Seva was officially registered as a Trust.

The core belief behind SIS is that professionals who are near and post-retirement, between the ages of 50 to 75, can convert these years into a period of renewed societal contribution. With improved health, fewer responsibilities, and decades of insight, senior professionals bring invaluable skills that could strengthen India's grassroots institutions. By facilitating pro bono consulting opportunities, SIS aims to bridge the gap between knowledge and need, passion and purpose.



Strengthen Internal Systems


Refine volunteer registration and categorization systems, including clearer skill mapping, simplified onboarding, and options such as uploading resumes for better role alignment
